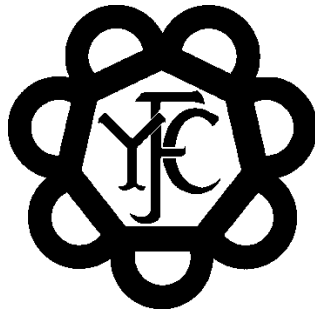

## IMPORTANT GUIDELINES

Please read carefully and follow instructions clearly in order to avoid any mistakes or confusion.

a.) Closing date for entries to be received at the County Office is by:

**9pm on MONDAY 25<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER 2017. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

We realise that some of the names on your form may change after this date. Providing the changes are notified to the competition Steward this will cause no problem.

b.) All competing members must have a **VALID CURRENT MEMBERSHIP CARD INCLUDING A PHOTO**. If new membership cards are required, the authorised membership forms must be received by the County Office no later than the deadline date above, along with the Entry Forms. Please note that all membership forms received at the Office must be signed by the member, as well as a Parent/Guardian if under 18 and must be signed and dated by the authorised Club Officer.

c.) Two sets of schedules are enclosed for each Club. A booklet set is for the Club Secretary's reference and the A4 stapled set is for dismantling and passing on rules to the competing members, you may need to copy extra.

d.) One entry form is enclosed per Club. This is for completion and to be returned to the County Office by the deadline, you can make a copy for your records in the back of the booklet copy where the entry form is included or please ask for a spare form to fill in. You can also complete an online copy from email or the website.

All rules and entry forms are emailed to Club Chairmen and Secretaries in advance and posted out if not collected from the Office by a Club representative.

e.) Any trophies relating to this competition held by any Club member must be returned to the County Office by the above deadline date along with the entry forms and no later than the Monday of the competition week.

f.) Please make sure all competitors are aware of the competition rules and times.

g.) **HELPING MEMEBRS WITH ADDITIONAL PHYSICAL or LEARNING REQUIREMENTS**

HFYFC seeks the inclusion of the full membership in its endeavors. Should a member require assistance to compete at a County Final due to any additional physical or learning requirements, every effort shall be made to ensure inclusion of any member with dignity, respect and confidentiality. HFYFC requests prior knowledge of assistance required in order to maximize the benefit to the individual.

## HFYFC General Rules

- 1 The competitions listed herein are open to members of Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) holding a valid, current YFC membership card. (Valid is classed as being of the correct year, having a signature and passport photograph of the member attached to the card.)
- 2 Any member who fails to produce a valid membership card will be able to purchase a temporary membership card from the office on the day, provided they are already a member. The card will cost £5 and will only be valid for the purpose of entering competitions on Rally day. Failure to produce a valid membership card will mean that the member will be unable to compete in the competition.
- 3 Age ranges for competitions are as follows:  
Senior – Open to members 26 years of age or under on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2017  
Intermediate – Open to members 21 years of age or under on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2017  
Junior – Open to members 16 years of age or under on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2017, and 10 years of age or over on the day of the competition.
- 4 Health and Safety requirements must be adhered to at all times.
- 5 Competitors must act in accordance with HFYFC policies, where applicable.
- 6 No alcohol is to be consumed by competitors before or during competitions. Any member judged to be under the influence of alcohol or any other substance will not be permitted to continue with the competition and may be disqualified.
- 7 The use of mobile phones during competitions is prohibited.
- 8 A white coat must be worn unless otherwise specified.
- 9 No competitor can enter the same competition in different age ranges.
- 10 All work must be that of the competitor who has booked in.
- 11 All work must have been made in the last 12 months.
- 12 Competitors must arrive on time and report to the competition steward **before** the start time of the competition to book in with necessary equipment to complete the competition.
- 13 In the event of a conflict between the competition rules and the general rules, the competition rules will govern.
- 14 All staged items must remain the responsibility of the competitor. HFYFC nor the site host accepts any liability for loss, damage or theft of any item.
- 15 No staged items or exhibits can be removed before prize giving at the penalty of disqualification.
- 16 For entries not according to schedule, 25% of marks awarded will be deducted. This includes any exhibits oversize.
- 17 The Chief Steward and Competitions Chairman reserve the right to cancel or amend any competition or rule at any time.
- 18 In all competitions the decision of the Chief Steward and the Competitions Chairman will be **final**.

**AUTUMN LIVE AND CARCASS JUDGING COMPETITION**

**RULES**

**CLASS 1 - PIG JUDGING (LIVE & CARCASS)**

1. **Open to any number of competitors from each Club 26 years, 21 years and 16 years of age and under on 1st September 2017. The same competitor may compete in all three classes - pigs, lambs and beef - but may **ONLY** compete in **ONE** age category in each class.**
2. Each competitor will assess ONE RING OF LIVE PIGS in the afternoon session and afterwards give reasons on the live animals. In the morning session each competitor will judge the CLASS OF CARCASSES. The live inspection and the carcass judging will be regarded as two separate sections of the competition, the marks being added together.
3. The carcasses and the live animals will be designated A, B, X and Y.
4. In the carcass judging competitors will be required to arrive at their placings by using the following scale of marks as an aid:-

Proportion of lean to fat .....	25
Fullness of eye muscle .....	25
Shape of leg.....	20
Lightness of shoulder .....	10
Firmness of whiteness of fat.....	5
Colour and texture of flesh .....	15
TOTAL .....	100

5. Handling of the carcasses will not be permitted.
6. **TIMING** – Up to two minutes will be allowed for each competitor to give his or her Reasons to the Judge in both the live and carcass sections. Competitors should be comparative rather than descriptive when stating their reasons. Two marks will be deducted for each fifteen seconds (or part thereof) that a competitor goes over the allotted two minutes. The marks will be deducted from the competitor's total.

# AUTUMN LIVE AND CARCASE JUDGING COMPETITION

## RULES

### **CLASS 2 - LAMB JUDGING (LIVE & CARCASE)**

1. **Open to any number of competitors from each Club 26 years, 21 years and 16 years of age and under on 1st September 2017. The same competitor may compete in all three classes - pigs, lambs and beef - but may **ONLY** compete in **ONE** age category in each class.**
2. Each competitor will assess ONE RING OF LIVE LAMBS in the afternoon session and afterwards give reasons on the live animals. In the morning session each competitor will judge the CLASS OF CARCASES. The live inspection and the carcass judging will be regarded as two separate sections of the competition, the marks being added together.
3. The carcasses and the live animals will be designated A, B, X and Y.
4. In the carcass judging competitors will be required to arrive at their placings by using the following scale of marks as an aid:-

	<b>Loin width &amp; fullness inc. eye muscle size</b>	<b>30</b>	
	Colour of lean, not too dark and texture fine-grained	5	
<b>Fat</b>	Depth of fat over legs and loin – correct proportions	20	
	Depth of fat on breasts in correct proportion	10	
	Ribs, light with high lean to fat ratio	<u>5</u>

6. **TIMING** – Up to two minutes will be allowed for each competitor to give his or her reasons to the Judge in both the live and carcass sections. Competitors should be comparative rather than descriptive when stating their reasons. Two marks will be deducted for each fifteen seconds (or part thereof) that a competitor goes over the allotted two minutes. The marks will be deducted from the competitor's total.

# AUTUMN LIVE AND CARCASE JUDGING COMPETITION

## RULES

### CLASS 3 - BEEF JUDGING (LIVE & CARCASE)

1. Open to any number of competitors from each Club 26 years, 21 years and 16 years of age and under on 1st September 2017. The same competitor may compete in all three classes - pigs, lambs and beef - but may **ONLY** compete in ONE age category in each class.
2. Each competitor will assess ONE RING OF LIVE BEEF CATTLE in the afternoon session and afterwards give reasons on the live animals. In the morning session each competitor will judge the CLASS OF BEEF CARCASES. The live inspection and the carcass judging will be regarded as two separate sections of the competition, the marks being added together.
3. The carcasses and the live animals will be designated A, B, X and Y. **Please note that this year the beef carcasses will be quartered, i.e. cut in half lengthways and cut in half again between the hindquarter and the forequarter which will be hanging separately.**
4. In the carcass judging competitors will be required to arrive at their placings by using the following scale of marks as an aid:-

<b>Conformation</b>	Shape of Buttock	10
	Thickness of rump/loin	15
	Depth and area of eye muscle	10
	Shape of forequarter	10
	Thickness of shoulder area	5
	<i>(neat, compact, blending well with f<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>)</i>	
	Colour/quality and texture of lean <i>(e.g. fine, coarse grain, bright "cherry" red marbling)</i>	10
<b>Fat</b>	Distribution of fat throughout carcass	10
	Amount of fat over eye muscle	15
	Amount of fat over brisket	5
	Colour, quality and texture of fat	<u>10</u>
	<i>(e.g. white/creamy/yellow/firm/oily)</i>	<u>100</u>

5. Handling of the carcasses will not be permitted.
6. **TIMING** – Up to two minutes will be allowed for each competitor to give his or her reasons to the Judge in both the live and carcass sections. Competitors should be comparative rather than descriptive when stating their reasons. Two marks will be deducted for each fifteen seconds (or part thereof) that a competitor goes over the allotted two minutes. The marks will be deducted from the competitor's total.
