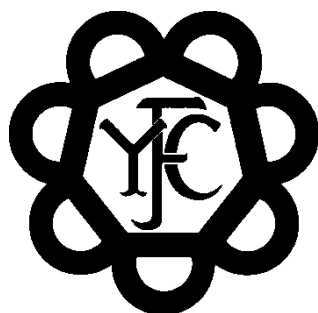

COMPETITION RULES

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES

Please read carefully and follow instructions clearly in order to avoid any mistakes or confusion.

a) Closing date for entries to be received at the County Office is:

9pm on MONDAY 30th March 2020. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

We realise that some of the names on your form may change after this date. Providing the changes are notified to the competition steward this will cause no problem.

- b) All competing members must have a **VALID CURRENT MEMBERSHIP CARD INCLUDING A PHOTO**. If new membership cards are required, the authorised membership forms must be received by the County Office no later than the deadline date above, along with the Entry Forms. Please note that all membership forms received at the office must be signed by the member, as well as a Parent/Guardian if under 18 and must be signed and dated by the authorised Club Officer.
- c) Two sets of schedules are enclosed for each Club. A booklet set is for the Club Secretary's reference and the A4 stapled set is for dismantling and passing on rules to the competing members, you may need to copy extra.
- d) One entry form is enclosed per Club. This is for completion and to be returned to the County Office by the deadline, you can make a copy for your records in the back of the booklet copy where the entry form is included or please ask for a spare form to fill in. You can also complete an online copy from email or the website.

All rules and entry forms are emailed to Club Chairmen and Secretaries in advance and posted out if not collected from the Office by a Club Representative.

- e) Any trophies relating to this competition held by any Club member must be returned to the County Office by the above deadline date, along with the entry form.
- f) Please make sure all competitors are aware of the competition rules and times.
- g) **HELPING MEMEBRS WITH ADDITIONAL PHYSICAL or LEARNING REQUIREMENTS.** HFYFC seeks the inclusion of the full membership in its endeavours. Should a member require assistance to compete at a County Final due to any additional physical or learning requirements, every effort shall be made to ensure inclusion of any member with dignity, respect and confidentiality. HFYFC requests prior knowledge of assistance required in order to maximize the benefit to the individual.

HFYFC General Rules

- 1 The competitions listed herein are open to members of Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) holding a valid, current YFC membership card. (Valid is classed as being of the correct year, having a signature and passport photograph of the member attached to the card.)
- 2 Any member who fails to produce a valid membership card will be able to purchase a temporary membership card from the office on the day, provided they are already a member. The card will cost £5 and will only be valid for the purpose of entering competitions on the day. Failure to produce a valid membership card will mean that the member will be unable to compete in the competition.
- 3 Age ranges for competitions are as follows:
Senior – Open to members 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019
Intermediate – Open to members 21 years of age or under on 1st September 2019
Junior – Open to members 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2019, and 10 years of age or over on the day of the competition.
- 4 Health and Safety requirements must be adhered to at all times.
- 5 Competitors must act in accordance with HFYFC policies, where applicable.
- 6 No alcohol is to be consumed by competitors before or during competitions. Any member judged to be under the influence of alcohol or any other substance will not be permitted to continue with the competition and may be disqualified.
- 7 The use of mobile phones during competitions is prohibited.
- 8 A white coat must be worn unless otherwise specified.
- 9 No competitor can enter the same competition in different age ranges.
- 10 All work must be that of the competitor who has booked in.
- 11 All work must have been made in the last 12 months.
- 12 Competitors must arrive on time and report to the competition steward **before** the start time of the competition to book in with necessary equipment to complete the competition.
- 13 In the event of a conflict between the competition rules and the general rules, the competition rules will govern.
- 14 All staged items must remain the responsibility of the competitor. Neither HFYFC nor the site host accepts any liability for loss, damage or theft of any item.
- 15 No staged items or exhibits can be removed before prize giving, at penalty of disqualification.
- 16 For entries not according to schedule, 25% of marks awarded will be deducted. This includes any exhibits oversize.
- 17 The Chief Steward and Competitions Chairman reserve the right to cancel or amend any competition or rule at any time.
- 18 In all competitions the decision of the Chief Steward and the Competitions Chairman will be **final**.
- 19 Unacceptable behaviour by competitors or supporters which brings YFC into disrepute; or which may be deemed to adversely affect other competitors/ performers will be penalised. This includes maintaining a respectful attitude towards all judges, stewards, officers and any other event helpers.

Time: To be staged by 9am on Sunday 26th April 2020

Entries: Open to one entry per Club. Competitors to be 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 and 10 years or over on the day of the competition

Rules:

- 1 Clubs to make and display a sign promoting the 2020 County Rally to the theme of WWII.
- 2 The sign is to be put up at a suitable place in the Club's area on private property, on a mobile structure, in accordance with the Highways regulations. Please note it is not permitted to put up signs on the side of the road (the highway) without first obtaining the correct permission from the Highways Department. Signs can be put up on privately-owned land adjacent to the highway – BUT SIGNS MUST NOT INTERFERE WITH DRIVER VISIBILITY.
- 3 The sign is to be a maximum of 3m x 3m, not including the mobile structure. This must be a one-sided sign to be viewed from one side on its approach. (If the sign is not going to be displayed on private property on a mobile structure, i.e. to be displayed on a roadside post as in previous years, the maximum size of this sign is 0.6m². 1m x 0.6m, 0.8 x 0.75m or 0.5 x 1.2m all to fit within the area allowed.)
- 4 Signs will be judged on rally day, but **photographic evidence of the sign in situ must be submitted to either the County Chairman (chairman@hfyfc.org.uk) and copy in the Competitions Committee Chairmen (competitions@hfyfc.org.uk) and the County Office (countyadmin@hfyfc.org.uk) by 9am on Sunday 26th April 2020.** Clubs will need to also let the County know the details of exactly where the sign is to be found to include road numbers, junctions or local landmarks such as: shops or pubs (County Officers will be checking they are up).
- 5 Signs are to remain in place until the day before Rally. Information on the sign must include a minimum of:
 - Date – Saturday 16th May 2020
 - Venue - Dorstone Court, Dorstone, HR3 6BE By Kind Permission of the Goring Family
 - Charity Number - 520998
 - Times for Day and Night – 9am Day / 9pm-2am Dance
 - Phone Number – 01432 274187
 - Website – www.hfyfc.org.uk
 - 2 x A3 sized spaces for Sponsors Logo – this will be provided by the County Office
- 6 The signs must be brought to the Rally site to be displayed on Rally day. They will need to be booked in and displayed by 10.30am. Signs can be brought to the site the evening before when exhibits are brought. Any signs not booked in and displayed will be penalised according to the HFYFC General Rules.

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Junior – Open to members 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2019, and 10 years of age or over on the day of the competition.
- 4 Health and Safety requirements must be adhered to at all times.
- 5 Competitors must act in accordance with HFYFC policies, where applicable.
- 6 No alcohol is to be consumed by competitors before or during competitions. Any member judged to be under the influence of alcohol or any other substance will not be permitted to continue with the competition and may be disqualified.
- 7 The use of mobile phones during competitions is prohibited.
- 8 A white coat must be worn unless otherwise specified.
- 9 No competitor can enter the same competition in different age ranges.
- 10 All work must be that of the competitor who has booked in.
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- 15 No staged items or exhibits can be removed before prize giving, at penalty of disqualification.

Class 3A Photography - Junior

Rules:

- 1 The competitor will be required to produce 3 photographs, 6" x 4", mounted on an **A3 Mount Board** to the theme **'What I am thankful for'**.
Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be penalised. Photos must be presented on mount board only and NOT in clip presentation frames. DO NOT USE CARD OR PAPER TO DISPLAY.
- 2 No names of clubs or counties to be marked on the front of any exhibits
- 3 Mount Boards will be displayed on large Display Boards. Photography entries should be brought to pre-rally for display. The display will then be kept by HFYFC for display at HFYFC Rally on 16th May 2020.
- 4 Photographs can be captured using film or digital photography
- 5 If digital photography is used as the capture method the photographs **MUST NOT** be digitally enhanced using photographic software on a computer. The preferred printing method would be to print the photos from the memory card using a commercial photo machine.
- 6 If a photo machine is used the appropriate size can be selected and the image can be turned into black & white, sepia or colour but no other alterations can be done for example cropping images, brightness/contrast, colour restoration/balance or any method which would digitally alter the photo quality.

- 1 The competitor will be required to produce 3 photographs, 6" x 4", mounted on an **A3 Mount Board** to the theme '**Remembering those we have lost**'.
Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be penalised. Photos must be presented on mount board only and NOT in clip presentation frames. DO NOT USE CARD OR PAPER TO DISPLAY.
- 2 No names of clubs or counties to be marked on the front of any exhibits
- 3 Mount Boards will be displayed on large Display Boards. Photography entries should be brought to pre-rally for display. The display will then be kept by HFYFC for display at HFYFC Rally on 16th May 2020.
- 4 Photographs can be captured using film or digital photography
- 5 If digital photography is used as the capture method the photographs **MUST NOT** be digitally enhanced using photographic software on a computer. The preferred printing method would be to print the photos from the memory card using a commercial photo machine.

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Class 4 Poultry Boning & Jointing**Time:** 9am**Entries:** Open to up to TWO (2) members per club aged 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 and 10 years or over on the day of the competition.

Rules:

- 1 Time allowed will be **THIRTY MINUTES** for boning and stuffing the bird and **TWENTY MINUTES** for jointing. Competitors taking over that time will be penalised at a rate of one mark for every thirty seconds or part thereof.
- 2 Each competitor will be required to Bone and Stuff one **trussed** bird and a second **trussed** bird is to be jointed and packed for the freezer. Competitors are to bring their **trussed** birds as bought from the butchers/supermarket with the giblets removed and not to cut anything off the chickens before the competition. The two **trussed** birds that competitors provide must each weigh between 1.6kg to 2.0kg.
- 3 **Procedure – Boning:** Competitors will be required to bone the trussed chicken, stuff and display. Competitors to provide their own stuffing, which may be made beforehand, and the carcase to be displayed.
Procedure – Jointing: Competitors will be required to remove the wishbone and display, remove both legs and divide into two (4 joints); remove both wings, taking away a little of the breast meat; remove the two breast joints and display joints suitably packed for deep freezing. Carcase to be displayed.
- 4 The use of newspaper is NOT permitted and any greaseproof paper used must NOT be removed from the table during the competition until directed by the Judge or Steward.
- 5 Competitors must wear clean white coats and suitable headwear during the competition.
- 6 Birds will be removed by stewards after judging on the day of the competition.

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Class 5 NFYFC Farm Safety Skills**Time:** Once entries are received, a timetable for the day will be released**Entries:** Open to ONE (1) team per club. A team shall consist of FOUR (4) members all of whom must be 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 and full members of a Club affiliated to NFYFC. For this competition members will be working as individuals on tasks 1-3 and as a team on task 4.

Certificates/Licences Required:

- Task 1: Tractor and Fertiliser Spreader:** Competitor requires a UK driving licence with F entitlement. This must be produced on the day of the competition in order to participate in this task. (The F entitlement can be gained at 16; but is automatically entitled with passing the car driving test). Tractor and appliance will be supplied by County.
- Task 2: Road Vehicle and Livestock Trailer:** Competitor requires a UK driving licence with B+E entitlement. This must be produced on the day of the competition in order to participate in this task. Trailer to be supplied by County.
- Task 3: ATV Handling:** Adequate training must have been completed by the competitor who will carry out the ATV task. A certificate of competence to show 'adequate training' in ATV Handling must be produced. A copy of the certificate must be handed to the judges on the day of the competition. ATV to be supplied by County.

A Certificate of Competence for ATV's, issued by City & Guilds NPTC is more than acceptable evidence of 'adequate training'. However, a certificate issued by another training provider will also be accepted. The most basic level of certificate which will be accepted is called an EASI (European All-Terrain Vehicle Safety Institute) certificate; available from most reputable ATV dealers. The EASI certificate is very much a dealer short induction course – a basic operators course designed to familiarise the operator with all the controls and operating procedures, which includes elements of safety. Whilst it ticks the box of 'adequate training', it should not be viewed as a replacement for a City & Guilds type course.

[Under the Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations 1998 (PUWER) there is a legal requirement that "adequate training", including the use of any towed equipment or attachments, be undertaken by those riding ATV's. The Health and Safety Executive (HSE) regards training provided by recognised training providers as "adequate" for the purposes of PUWER].

- Task 4: First Aid:** The team member in control of the first aid task must hold a current first aid certificate of either the British Red Cross, St John Ambulance or an alternative nationally recognised body. Note, a Paediatric First Aid certificate is acceptable for the HFYFC round of the competition. The certificate must be no more than 3 years old. A copy of the certificate must be handed to the competition judges on the day of each round of the competition. Competitors to supply their own First Aid kit.
- Failure to provide the requested certificates will result in the team being disqualified and not allowed to compete.**

Procedure:

- All competitors must take into account Health and Safety at all times. Correct personal protective equipment must be worn. Safe start and safe stop procedures must be adhered to.** All equipment must be returned to its original place after completion of each task.
- The team shall appoint a leader who will undertake the duties of a foreman. In addition to his/her foreman duties, they must also carry out one of the tasks.
- Competitors to provide their own tools.
- Task 1: 3-Point Linkage Task**
Equipment required: **1.** Tractor (no larger than 100 hp); **2.** A PTO-driven Implement (Implement to be confirmed closer to the day) to attach via 3 point linkage (PTO shaft included with it); **3.** A PTO shaft and guard on its own.

- 1 An individual competitor is required to carry out daily maintenance and safety checks on a tractor prior to the commencement of this task. The competitor is to carry out a verbal risk assessment with the judge on the task they will be completing.
 - 2 The individual competitor is to take the PTO guard off the PTO shaft; before putting it back on again (as though replacing a damaged one with a new one). The competitor is to inspect and verbally report on the condition of the PTO shaft, and explain safety checks.
 - 3 The individual competitor is to attach an implement to the three-point linkage of a tractor, including the PTO shaft.
 - 4 The combination should then be prepared for travel along a public highway, and the competitor to follow a course including turning on to, travelling along, and turning off a simulated public road.
 - 5 Competitor to park the implement and unhitch, and return the tractor to the original position.
- 5 Task 2: Road Vehicle and Livestock Trailer**
- Equipment required: **1.** Typical farm 4x4 vehicle i.e. Land Rover Defender or similar pickup with a towing capacity of 3,500kg; **2.** A livestock trailer.
- 1 An individual competitor is required to carry out daily maintenance and safety checks on the vehicle and trailer prior to the commencement of this task. The competitor is to carry out a verbal risk assessment with the judge on the task they will be completing, as well as the compatibility of the vehicle and trailer combination (weights, towball height, etc).
 - 2 Competitor to hitch the trailer to the vehicle.
 - 3 The combination should then be prepared for travel along a public highway, and the competitor to follow a course including turning on to, travelling along, and turning off a simulated public road.
 - 4 Competitor to position the trailer (including reversing) ready to load livestock. (If a gateway or doorway is not available on site, a simulated gateway should be marked out).
 - 5 Competitor to park the trailer and unhitch, and return the vehicle to the original start position.
- 6 Task 3: ATV**
- 1 An individual competitor is required to carry out daily maintenance and safety checks on a sit astride ATV prior to commencement of task. The competitor is to carry out a verbal risk assessment with the judge on the task they will be completing.
 - 2 The competitor is required to drive an ATV through a 'set' course as instructed by the judge; this will involve hitching and loading a trailer.
- 7 Task 4: First Aid**
- Suggested Equipment: **1.** First Aid Kit
- 1 During the course of the practical exercise, a mock farm accident will be staged. Teams will be informed when the accident happens; the Farm Foreman must then decide which of his team members shall deal with the situation. However, other teams members may be instructed to given assistance. It is expected that there will be by-standers who may be questioned regarding the accident. The First Aid Judge will indicate when the casualty has been satisfactorily dealt with and when the member or members may recommence work.
 - 2 Knowledge of elementary First Aid is necessary, but in no case will competitors be expected to render assistance further than instructed in the Joint First Aid Manual of St. John Ambulance and The British Red Cross (available from WH Smith or other large bookshops). The Highway Code and Farm Safety Regulations must be applied at all times. If, in the opinion of the Judges, a competitor is undertaking a Task in a way likely to endanger themselves or others; the competitor will be stopped and the danger brought to his attention. The competitor will be expected to correct the matter and then continue with the Task.

Timing:

- 1 Competitors will have a total of 25 minutes to complete the 4 tasks. As the tasks are running concurrently, tasks 1-3 should be completed by different members of the team. Task 4 should be run as a team during the 25 minutes.

The top 2 teams at the county round will be requested to compete again at the West Midlands Area Round on Saturday 6th June 2020 at Kenilworth Show.

Additional Rule:

8 Task 5: Hazard Perception (National Final ONLY)

- 1 The 4 individuals from the above tasks will join together to undertake a team hazard perception task. They will be asked to identify 5 hazard scenarios such as: working at height, working with machinery and awareness of power cables.
- 2 Competitors will have a maximum of 5 minutes per scenario.

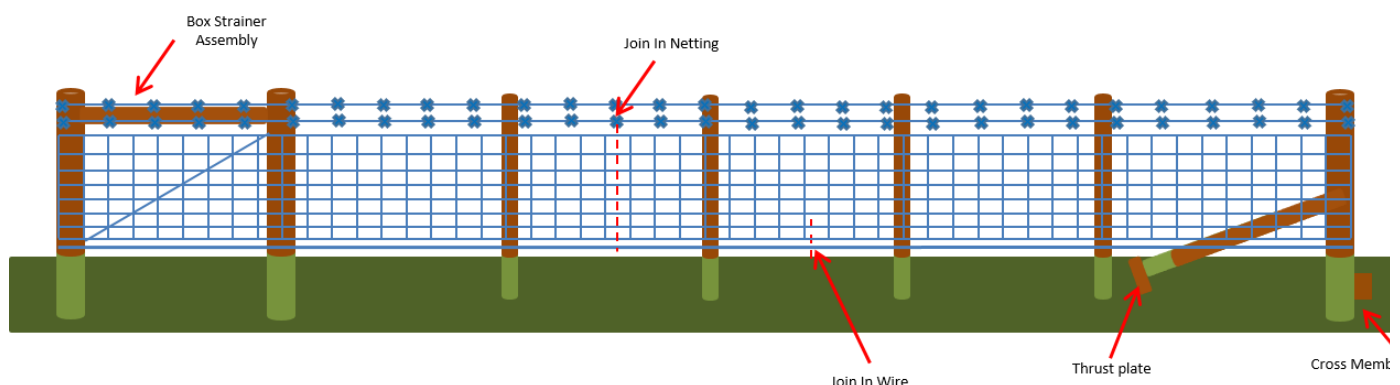

Health & Safety: ESSENTIAL READING FOR ALL COMPETITORS
It is essential that all competitors read the Health and Safety Executive's guidance paper concerning fencing and note is taken of the safe working practices and protective clothing equipment that is recommended. The Health and Safety Executive guidance paper 'Fencing' (AFAG104) is included as an appendix to these rules.

- Procedure:**
- 1 The team will be required to erect a 13m stock proof boundary fence in a straight line, using the materials provided (as illustrated in the diagram)
 - 2 At the start of the fence there will be a box strainer assembly using a horizontal strut and high tensile diagonal brace wire. At the other end; the fence will be secured with a mild steel fencing-strainer assembly, using a strainer and angled strut (strut to be secured using a thrust plate, and strainer to be secured using a cross member).
 - 3 It shall be constructed of post and netting with 2 strands of mild steel barbed wire above the netting, and one strand of mild steel plain wire below the netting.
 - 4 The plain wire and barbed wire to be tensioned and tied with a knot at both ends. There must also be a join in the plain wire using a hand tied knot where indicated on the diagram.
 - 5 A join in the netting must be made by hand where indicated on the diagram.
 - 6 The team are required to prepare a written risk assessment/method statement, which is to be handed to the Chief Steward on the day of the competition - prior to the competition start. Failure to provide a written risk assessment/method statement or failure to comply with it; or working unsafely, will result in immediate disqualification. **Please see NFYFC Fence Erecting Risk Assessment Template below. This may be used and completed as teams wish (Risk 1 already entered as an example).**

- 9 Competitors to supply their own materials
- 10 Only hand tools will be allowed and the teams themselves must provide these. No power tools or chainsaws are allowed.

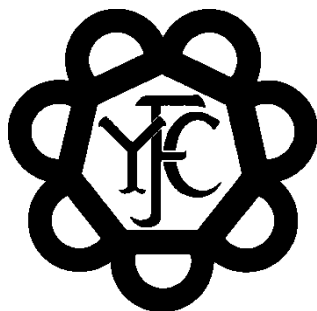
