COMPETITION RULES

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES

Please read the rules carefully and follow all instructions clearly, to avoid any mistakes or confusion.

a) The closing date for entries to be received at the County Office is:

9PM Monday 1st September 2025. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

We realise that some of the names on your entry form may change after this date. Providing the changes are notified to the competition steward this will cause no problem.

b) All competing members must have a VALID CURRENT MEMBERSHIP, as defined under the HFYFC General Rules. **PLEASE NOTE THIS COMPETITION WILL BE THE FIRST COMPETITION FOR HFYFC IN THE 2025-2026 YEAR. ALL COMPETITORS MUST HAVE AN UPDATED MEMBERSHIP TO COMPETE. MEMBERS RENEWING AND NEW MEMBERS WILL BE ABLE TO SIGN UP FROM FRIDAY 8TH AUGUST 2025 AND ALL COMPETING MEMBERS MUST BE FULLY SIGNED UP BY 12 noon ON TUESDAY 16TH SEPTEMBER ELSE THEY WILL BE UNABLE TO COMPETE ON THE DAY OF THE COMPETITION**

c) It is advised that a set of these rules are printed for the Club Secretary's reference and for dismantling and passing on rules to the competing members.

d) One entry form is enclosed per Club. This is for completion and must be returned to the County Office by the deadline, all entry forms **MUST** be completed in Excel format.

e) Any trophies relating to this competition held by any Club member must be returned to the County Office by the above deadline date, along with the entry form.

f) Please make sure all competitors are aware of the competition rules and times and we advise clubs to avoid members 'clashing' with multiple competitions at the same time to ensure smooth running of the day.

g) **HELPING MEMBERS WITH ADDITIONAL PHYSICAL or LEARNING REQUIREMENTS.** HFYFC seeks the inclusion of the full membership in its endeavours. Should a member require assistance to compete at a County Final due to any additional physical or learning requirements, every effort shall be made to ensure inclusion of any member with dignity, respect and confidentiality. HFYFC requests prior knowledge of assistance required in order to maximize the benefit to the individual.

Note: All Classes must be read in conjunction with the HFYFC General Rules and competitors should familiarise themselves with these rules prior to competing to avoid penalties, including any entries not according to schedule.

HFYFC GENERAL RULES

These General Rules are to be adhered to for all HFYFC Competitions

1. The competitions listed herein are open to members of Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) holding a valid, current YFC membership. (Valid is classed as being fully processed and authorised and of the current year, a copy of the card can be a printed copy or electronic version shown on a device.)
2. Failure to produce a fully processed and authorised valid membership will mean that the member will be unable to compete in the competition.
3. Age ranges for competitions are as follows:
 - Senior – Open to members 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2025
 - Intermediate – Open to members 21 years of age or under on 1st September 2025
 - Junior – Open to members 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2025, and 10 years of age or over on the day of the competition.
4. Health and Safety requirements must be adhered to at all times
5. Competitors must act in accordance with HFYFC policies, where applicable.
6. No alcohol is to be consumed by competitors before or during the competitions. Any member judged to be under the influence of alcohol, or any other substance will not be permitted to continue with the competition and may be disqualified. Alcohol will also not be used or displayed in any competition (unless specified in the competition rules). Empty bottles can be used for display purposes only.
7. The use of mobile phones by competitors during competitions is prohibited.
8. A white coat must be worn where specified.
9. No competitor can enter the same competition in different age ranges.
10. All work must have been made by members in the last 12 months.
11. All work must be that of the competitor who has booked in, if the entry is being booked in by somebody else then the person booking it in must have a copy of the competitor's card.
12. The entry to a competition cannot have been entered into a previous HFYFC competition.
13. Club or County names must not be displayed on any part of entries or displays (unless otherwise stated in the specific competition rules) – *please be careful when using photographs including club tops.*
14. Where more than one entry per club is allowed in a competition, where applicable, only the points of the highest scoring entry will count towards the cups and trophies and overall results.
15. Competitors must arrive on time and report to the competition steward **before** the start time of the competition to book in with necessary equipment to complete the competition.
16. In the event of a conflict between the competition rules and the general rules, the competition rules will govern.
17. All staged items or exhibits must remain the responsibility of the competitor. Neither HFYFC nor the site host accepts any liability for loss, damage or theft of any item.
18. No staged items or exhibits can be removed before prize giving, at penalty of disqualification.
19. The Chief Steward and the Competitions Chairmen reserve the right to cancel or amend any competition rule at any time.
20. In all competitions the decision of the Chief Steward and the Competitions Chairmen will be final.
21. Unacceptable behaviour or questionable material by competitors or supporters which brings YFC into disrepute; or which may be deemed to adversely affect other competitors/performers will be

penalised. This includes maintaining a respectful attitude towards all judges, stewards, officers and any other event helpers.

Deductions

22. Late entries

- a. Any entry received by the County Office after the date and time specified on the rules for the competition, will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis, and the decision will come from the County Chairman and Competitions Chairman, on whether they can compete and if any deductions will apply to the club's score.
- b. The member partaking in the competition is still eligible to get a prize card and compete at the next round.
- c. The deduction will occur after the prize cards have been written out. The deduction will apply to any trophy handed out on the day, overall day scores and the end of year trophies.

23. Transferring of classes

- a. If a club wishes to transfer a member into a class (which previously had no entry) after the entries have been received by the County Office on the date and time specified on the rules for the competition a 25% deduction will incur for the CLUBS score. The member partaking in the competition is still eligible to get a prize card and compete at the next round. The deduction will occur after the prize cards have been written out and will apply to any trophy handed out on the day and the end of year trophies.

24. For entries not according to schedule

- a. 25% of marks awarded will be deducted for all entries that are not according to the schedule - This includes any exhibits oversize, missing items (recipe/photos etc). If there are multiple things wrong with the entry, there will only be one deduction of 25% applied.
- b. 25% is deducted from the total score given by the judge, but if they still place after a deduction is awarded the Competitor will still be eligible to gain a prize card with the deducted score and will still be eligible to qualify for the next rounds where applicable.

25. In competitions with time limits

- a. In competitions with time limits, the following marks will be deducted if the competitor overruns - (unless otherwise stated in rules – i.e., stock judging):

Competition Length	Penalty
Up to 30 minutes	5% of total marks per minute or part thereof
31 to 60 minutes	5% of total marks per two minutes or part thereof
61 to 120 minutes	5% of total marks per five minutes or part thereof
121 minutes and over	5% of total marks per ten minutes or part thereof

- b. The Competitor will still be eligible to gain a prize card with the deducted score and will still be eligible to qualify for the next rounds where applicable.
- c. 5% is deducted from the total score given by the judge.
26. Any disagreements from clubs/competitors about markings or deductions must be made on the day of competition to the Chief Steward or Competitions team, and will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
27. In the event that a deduction is applied for any reason and the subsequent mark results in a decimal place, if the decimal place is 0.5 or above, it shall be rounded up to the next whole number. If the decimal place is 0.49 or below, it shall be rounded down to the next whole number.

PLOUGHING CLASSES

PLEASE NOTE:

- a) No GPS/Electronic Navigational aids may be used in any of the classes.
- b) All Ploughmen must report directly to the field as signposted on their arrival to site.
- c) There is to be no walking of the furrows in the unaided ploughing classes once the competition has commenced.
- d) Ploughing should be carried out in a workman like style, and the Ploughing Chief Steward has the right to move a competitor from the UNAIDED CLASSES to the AIDED CLASSES if the work is not deemed to be of a suitable standard.
- e) Should the Ploughing Chief Steward deem the competitor to not be working to the required standard then competitors may also be asked to stop.
- f) **All tractors and ploughs must be clean before entering the ploughing fields.** Any competitors who turn up with dirty equipment will not be allowed to enter the fields and therefore **WILL NOT** be allowed to compete and will be asked to return home.
- g) **Any competing member who withdraws from any of the ploughing classes (Class 1, 2, 3, 4, 5a and 5b) after 5pm on Friday 12TH September 2025 will be fined £10 (to be charged to the club), as well as any competitor who is asked to return home if their tractor and/or plough is unclean or fails to turn up on the day of the competition. Withdrawals should be made to competitions@hfyfc.org.uk**
- h) All equipment used must be fit for purpose.
- i) Marks will be awarded **in accordance with the marking scheme laid down by the Society of Ploughmen (please see attached scoresheets)** in each of Classes 1, 2, 3 and 4.
- j) **Competitors in classes 5a and 5b will be awarded 50% of the marks.**
- k) In Classes 5a and 5b, the degree of assistance shall be at the discretion of the Chief Steward. Should the Chief Steward deem the competitors to receive excessive assistance, the competitor may be asked to stop.

Class 1: Ploughing – Conventional U28

2. SEMI-DIGGER WORK – Minimum depth 6 inches – Maximum depth 8 inches
3. **ANY COMPETITORS ARRIVING AFTER 9AM WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE**

2. Not more than **FIVE (5)** furrow ploughs to be used
3. Minimum depth 7 inches – Maximum depth 8 inches
4. **ANY COMPETITORS ARRIVING AFTER 9AM WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE**

1. Ploughing with any make of CONVENTIONAL PLOUGH.
2. Not more than **FIVE (5)** furrow ploughs to be used
3. Semi-Digger Work: Minimum depth 7 inches – Maximum depth 8 inches
4. **Competitors in this class need to bring assistance; help may only be given from the headlands**
5. **ANY COMPETITORS ARRIVING AFTER 9AM WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE**

DOMESTIC SECTION

Class 6: Display of Farm Produce

Time: Staged by 10:30am

Entries: Open to ONE (1) entry per Club. All competitors to be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2025 and 10 years of age or over on the day of the competition. Any number of members may contribute.

Marks:

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Rules:

1. Clubs must display a bale of hay.
2. In addition to Rule 1, clubs must also provide FOUR (4) of the farm crops from the list below, as stated:
 - a. 4 Mangolds or 4 Fodder Beet Roots or 4 Sugar Beet Roots
 - b. 4 Swedes or 4 Turnips
 - c. 4 Potatoes (any variety)
 - d. One whole plant of maize without roots
 - e. 4 Cooking Apples

For example, a valid club entry would comprise: 1 bale of hay, 4 Fodder Beet Roots, 4 Swedes, One whole plant of maize without roots and 4 Cooking Apples.

3. Clubs must display all items either on a tarpaulin sheet or wool sack.
4. Clubs are to supply the tarpaulin sheet or wool sack.
5. The farm produce may be washed but may not be trimmed, unless stated above.

Class 7: A Homemade Herefordshire Hamper

Time: Staged by 10:30am

Entries: Open to ONE (1) entry per Club. All competitors to be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2025 and 10 years of age or over on the day of the competition. Any number of members may contribute.

Rules:

1. Clubs are to make a hamper including a minimum of 6 DIFFERENT HOMEMADE ITEMS.
2. The hamper must be suitable to feed at least 4 people. The hamper must be suitably displayed within a maximum display area of 1m x 1m x 1m.
3. The whole hamper including the container in which it is displayed will be raffled off, please ensure you only use items that you do not want back.
4. The hamper must include:
 - A non-alcoholic drink
 - A sweet item
 - A savoury item
 - A fruit item
 - A biscuit
 - A cupcake
5. All food items must be suitably wrapped in cling film and must be clearly labelled. For the avoidance of doubt, clingfilm can be found here: [Bacofoil Refillable EasyCut Cling Film Dispenser, 10m : Amazon.co.uk: Health & Personal Care](#)
6. In addition to Rule 4, clubs must supply samples of all the following for the judge to taste:
 - The sweet item
 - The savoury item
 - The fruit item
 - The biscuit item
 - The cupcake
7. All samples must match the items in the hamper, must be covered in cling film, clearly labelled and in a sealed box.
8. As all hampers will be given away on the day via a raffle – your hamper will remain untouched by the judges, they will only taste the samples you provide
9. Raffle tickets will be sold on the day of the competition, with all hampers to be raffled, except for the first placed hamper, which will be given to the site hosts.
10. All money raised in the raffle will be donated to HFYFC (Charity Number: 520998) with the draw taking place prior to Prizegiving on the day of the competition.

Rules:

1. Competitors are required to produce ONE (1) photograph, 7 inches by 5 inches, mounted on a A4 card, to the theme '**A Happy Moment**'.
2. The photograph can be captured using film or digital photograph.
3. If digital photography is used as the capture method the photographs MUST NOT be digitally enhanced using photographic software on a computer. The preferred printing method would be to print the photos from the memory card using a commercial photo machine.
4. If a photo machine is used the appropriate size can be selected and the image can be turned into black & white, sepia or colour but no other alterations can be done for example cropping images, brightness/contrast, colour restoration/balance or any method which would digitally alter the photo quality.
5. Photos should be self-explanatory however a title is allowed or a three-sentence script (30 words maximum) anywhere on the entry although text must be separate and NOT within the photograph or this will be perceived as being digitally enhanced.
6. The photographs must have been taken by members of a Young Farmers' Club 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2025 and may be trade processed.
